# **GARBAGE & RECYCLING**

# What's accepted as Garbage?

Common non-hazardous household waste that cannot be recycled.

# Why should you bag your garbage before dropping it in the cart?

This will help keep your cart smelling fresh and prevents flyaway litter as the cart is emptied into the truck.

## One Cart not enough?

Each address is assigned one garbage cart and one recycling cart. Extra Carts can be requested by calling (252) 478-5186 for \$11.00 extra a month. Nothing is allowed on the ground.

# Can I take my garbage cart when I move?

Garbage and recycle carts belong to the town of Spring Hope. If you move, leave your carts in your garage or behind your home.

- ⇒ Automobile Fluids
- ⇒ Fluorescent light bulbs
- ⇒ Batteries
- ⇒ Lighter fluid/ Kerosene
- ⇒ Paints/ Lacquers/ Polishes
- ⇒ Pesticides/ Herbicides
- ⇒ Building materials

# How to Position your carts correctly at the curb:


- Place carts with the handle towards your home and the lid opening towards the road.
- Carts should be away from light poles,
   mailboxes and fire hydrants.
- Pull all carts out the night before and remove from the street by Friday night.

FOUR FEET of space is required between cart and other items so that the truck's arm mechanism can grasp the cart.

#### It's Your Turn...

To join hundreds of communities in North Carolina and thousands of communities nationwide who sort their recyclables. Effective Oct 1st, 2009, we have Statewide Landfill Ban on Plastic Containers. To stay in compliance with this ban, the Town sanitation customers will no longer be able to dispose of plastic containers with their household waste. The landfill ban refers to "plastic containers" that has a neck smaller than the base, "excluding plastic motor oil containers."

# BULK WASTE

### What's accepted?

Refuse weighing in excess of 50 Lbs. Such as furniture, box springs, mattress etc...

### What cannot be picked up?

- Liquid Paint
- Hazardous materials
- Batteries
- Wooden Pallets
- **Electronic Equipment**
- Construction Materials

- Heaters
- Toilets, Carpet, and Flooring
- Gasoline, oil, and Tires

### HOW TO SCHEDULE?

Don't forget - doors must be removed from appliances before they can be picked up.

# YARD WASTE

Frequently asked Questions:

#### What is considered yard waste?

Twigs, grass, hedge clippings, hay, pine straw, pinecones, other vegetative matter, limbs.

#### What should NOT go in my yard waste?

Animal waste, household waste, garbage, mulch bags, building materials, fences, poles, plants in pots, plastic trays, dirt and rocks, tree stumps.

#### Where do I put my yard waste?

Place yard waste between the curb and the sidewalk. In areas without sidewalks place yard waste within 6' from the road but behind the curb.

#### How do I package my yard waste?

leaves can Now be racked to the curb and don't have to be bagged up

DO NOT place yard waste in a Waste Industries cart.

#### When is Leaf and Limb Picked up?

The leaf and limb schedule can be found on the calendar attached.

#### Can any size limbs be picked up?

Limbs must be four foot (4') in length or less. Limbs must be less than six inches (6") in diameter.

#### Can I mix limbs in with my bagged leaves?

No— Always keep leaves and limbs separate from each other. The facility that accepts our yard debris requires leaves, limbs, and other organic material to be separate

#### How much leaf and limb can be picked up at one time?

Town staff will pick up approximately four cubic yards (the volume of a pickup truck bed). This is essential to continue to keep the costs of leaf and limb manageable.

#### What if I have more than four cubic yards of yard waste?

The Town will charge \$75/hour (added to utility bill) and reserves the right to charge additional dump fees if excess (greater than 4 cubic yards) yard debris/leaf and limbs are picked up. This is a necessary service fee to recoup time and funds.

#### Will the town pick up Debris from contractors?

No— The Town will NOT pick up debris from contractors. If you hire a contractor to trim trees, shrubs, or landscape the contractor is responsible for removing the debris.

# CEMETERY SERVICES

The town owns and operates two cemeteries - Meeks Cemetery and Oakdale cemetery.

Records are maintained by the Town. The town will remove all flowers from each cemetery on the 1st Monday of March and October. Please have everything you do not want thrown away removed no later than one week prior to this day.

#### How to Schedule a Funeral:

Your selected funeral home has the needed paperwork and will contact the Town to make arrangements for your opening and closing. If you have questions concerning the cemeteries, please call Michele at (252) 478-5186 x 102.
